Friday: Bring before God the children known to us, in our family, along our street, in our local school, praying that they may grow in strength and wisdom and come to know Jesus as their Lord.

Saturday: On the world front there are many situations we must continually bring before God daily: the Church of Pakistan struggling to cope with the flood devastation: the Chilean miners still trapped in the mine: the struggles still going on in Afghanistan and Iraq: the hardships caused by HIV/AIDS and poverty all over the world. Pray that God may give grace and strength to all who go out to alleviate such suffering.

Vacancy Update

What's happening? - Quite a lot! Here's an update.

We all want the process of finding our new minister to go smoothly and as quickly as possible so your nominating committee has been meeting with Rev. Robert Simpson to get the framework right. By the time this newsletter is published, we will have a new person as our interim moderator and we thank Robert and wish him well.

We have a timescale and when possible will keep everyone informed as we follow through on it.

Firstly, the parish profile and the advert are complete. Both will be put on the church web site when November's Life and Work is published.

We should have applications to consider and be able to draw up a long list in December. During January and perhaps February 2011 interviews can be held. Obviously, applicants will want to visit and ask questions as they too try to find if God is calling them to our parish.

After this part of the process, we should be able to draw up a short list which leads us to go and hear them preach. Only after this stage will we be able to bring a sole nominee to the whole congregation.

So, you can see that it will be late spring or early summer before we have our new minister. This is assuming everything goes to plan!

The nominating committee is very conscious of our need for wisdom, guidance and support as we carry out what we know to be a task entrusted to us to represent the congregation. We need your prayers, encouragement and understanding as we take each step of this journey-----it's not just our journey but our prayer is that with God's help, together we will reach His destination.
