Elder David Cooper - Tribute made to  
Congregation - Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2011

As well as being a day of hope and expectation, it is also a very sad day in the life of our Congregation as a result of the sudden and unexpected death of Elder David Cooper earlier this week while on holiday in Malta.

David who had only recently retired, now that he had more time available had many plans for the future, helping and developing this Congregation; he was an Elder for 13 years; he was a dedicated District Elder; he was enthusiastic especially in his work with the young people, and the more elderly at the John Bellany Day Centre. He always came up with good ideas and he played his part in our worship regularly taking part in our services, especially the early morning service. He was due to take part musically in the Easter services.

He played an active role in the Kirk Session and from a Session Clerk's perspective I could not have asked for a better Elder. Everything he was asked to do he did willingly, and you knew that everything David did was well researched and well thought through.

David had a great future in the wider work of the Church and had recently been nominated to take over from Duncan Morgan as our Presbytery Elder. He had asked to serve Presbytery in Youth and Mission work. Sadly Presbytery will not now benefit from David's talents.

David drew up our Profile in our search for a new Minister and also served on the Nominating Committee. He was a strong supporter of our Sole Nominee and without giving away too many confidences of the Nominating Committee; it was he who proposed that Mrs Herbold Ross should be our Sole Nominee.

He last visited his District on either Monday or Tuesday morning, (some cannot remember what day it was!) quite early, and with his usual enthusiasm let everyone know he was off on holiday but he wanted to visit before leaving and to encourage all his parishioners to come to Church to day. I hope as many as possible are here this morning.

We will all miss David, his passing leaves a large gaping hole in this Congregation which will be almost impossible to fill, but this morning we think and pray for his wife Lorraine, son Stuart, daughters Deborah and Jennifer and all members of his wider family.
